## INTER-PAR | Published in all parishes of the Diocese of Hearst-Moosonee Truth and Reconciliation A First Step Towards Reconciliation 4/4

Our Reconciliation gathering in Moosonee on February 2, 3, and 4, 2024 was held locally for the people of Moosonee and Moose Factory. Hopefully in the near future something similar might be done in the coastal communities.

This being said, Father Sudhakar Jayabalan, HGN from Fort Albany, and Father Raphael Obiadi, SMMM from Attawapiskat were invited to see what is being done and how it could be adapted to their respective communities. Father Sudhakar came to Moosonee via the winter ice road and Father Raphael had to fly in due to the mild weather.

At the conclusion of our gathering I asked them what was their impressions about the weekend. Here is the response from Fr Sudhakar:

"It's my great pleasure indeed to write a note about the Reconciliation gathering held in Moosonee in February 2024. The gathering with our Indigenous community members was really a wonderful event, which led us to work together listening to the voice of the Indigenous community. Our hearts were moved towards progress in the path towards reconciliation.

Everything that was discussed during the gathering was informative, powerful, and heart-touching, which is a hopeful sign for reconciliation. Taking these first or baby steps through this gathering, by working together we can accomplish great things in a greater way. I find the Spirit is already helping us all to journey together for reconciliation towards healing."

"In Moosonee I was privileged to witness an outpouring of emotions, sharing different stories, and opening hearts to reconciliation. I must say that our meeting of Indigenous survivors and the Diocese of Hearst and Moosonee was a very cordial and hopeful experience. Reconciliation is never easy, but both parties were committed to moving forward and finding common ground. I appreciate the privilege and opportunity of participating in the process and hope it can serve as a model for future endeavours. Listening to both parties dialogue and map a way forward was impressive. The highlight of the meeting was that we had Indigenous people and survivors willing to walk together with the church, who also saw hope that reconciliation could be achieved. The way forward is "Indigenousled" and a diocese willing to commit to this process. I pray that mutual love and coexistence, which lead to true healing, are achieved by the grace of God."
